### **A PEW WITH A VIEW**

At communion last Sunday Jim kindly reminded me to sit in the front pews. Out of habit I normally sit in the family pew where you get a good view of the minister, pulpit, choir and the congregation. Maybe that is why my ancestors chose that pew (3). I always feel uncomfortable down at the side pews turning to the left or right. Near the end of the service my neck was sore so I had a look around the Remembrance Book area and a picture frame caught my eye ... it looked familiar! After the service I had a closer look and discovered it was a sketch of the church by Alec Fyfe (my Grandfather) and dated 1956. He was a keen artist and donated many of his sketches to local historic groups. He was an Elder in the church for many years and he was also in the choir. He encouraged his family to attend church and used to give my sister and I a penny to

put in the plate (1950s). His love of the local countryside inspired him to write Clackmannan Tower poem (page 9) and every Sunday after church we all walked to the local beauty spots.

I was so surprised to see the sketch again after all these years and it brought back so many happy memories ... So ... I'm glad I sat in a "pew with a different view".
