

As we approach another season of church life filled with activity I hope that I will have returned from my holiday well rested, but I am afraid I can make no promises. I will no doubt have had a wonderful time seeing my family in person for the first time in a long time, but whether I am rested remains to be seen.

I was able to visit my grandfather who is 96 - he will be 97 come January. I am grateful for every phone call and opportunity to see him, as I know that he likely won't be around for much longer. But I always try to be grateful for the time I spend with others regardless of how much time I suspect I may have left with them.

In likewise fashion, I hope that we as a kirk and indeed as a nation remember the lives of those who have gone before us more than one day a year. We will gather together once more to remember those who gave their lives to release the world from tyranny's grip all the while watching the news as we see tyrants flex their hands waiting to grasp at the world.

As someone who has had family who served the public through the military branches I find the time spent on Remembrance Sunday very meaningful. I'm sure I'll be run ragged by the time the day is over, but it is a meaningful way to spend the day. My dad's father served in the air force during Vietnam flying F4s. My mother's father served in the army during the Korean conflict and was fortunate enough to be made organist of the Tokyo Army Choir. My great-grandfather served in World War 2 as a young lad, younger than was allowed to enlist, fighting for Great Britain. His family was fortunate enough that he was one of the men who came home.

On Remembrance Sunday, we remember those who did not come home. Those who paid the ultimate price and I sincerely hope that they are remembered for their sacrifice more than once a year.

It is all too easy to rely on holidays, and holy days, to help guide us in our thinking, feeling, and believing. In the same way we are still Christians when it's not Sunday; we still remember our Saviour's death when it is not Easter; we still sing carols celebrating his birth when it is not Christmas; we still remember the Christians who gave their lives for the faith even when it

is not All Saints Day.

So wherever Remembrance finds you this year, I hope you remember fondly those who have gone before us and given everything for our sake, whether it is an armed service member, a Christian Martyr, or Jesus himself. Let us reflect during this time of Remembrance on what it means to serve, and take that service into our every day, not just on special days.

IMPORTANT NOTICE BANK CHARGES

We have been advised by the Bank of Scotland that, as from 13th November, our accounts will be changing to charity accounts, which will result in bank charges.

These charges will be incurred for cash deposits at a rate of 75p per £100, cheque deposits at 50p per cheque, credit in fees (a fee of 42p for each deposit made), and 50p for each cheque we issue. A rough calculation estimates that our bank charges would work out in the region of £10 - £15 per month.

Many of you already gift your offerings by standing order. This method of giving is free for both you and us. It also saves time, is more secure, saves money on the purchase of envelopes, and means that you do not need to think about having the correct cash available to put in your envelope.

If you currently give by envelope or cheque, would you consider changing to standing order? If you would like a form, our bank details, or more information, please speak with **Joyce Morrison** or **Les Pike**, who will be happy to help.

News from the Church of Scotland Website

On behalf of the Church of Scotland, the Moderator has welcomed the ceasefire that promises an end to the conflict in Gaza. Rt Rev Rosie Frew offers prayers for the region saying:

"We rejoice at the news of the peace deal which promises to see an end to the violence in Gaza, the immediate release of the hostages, and the release of some Palestinian prisoners.

"The events of 7th October 2023 cast a dark shadow over the nation of Israel and the people of Gaza. The tragedy of those attacks is now, we pray, drawing to a close. We especially pray for all those afflicted by loss and those whose sorrow is beyond measure.

"The task that now lies before the world is no less important; the building of a just peace, a move towards a viable State of Palestine, and the rebuilding of shattered lives and communities in Gaza and in Israel. The scale of the devastation is beyond comprehension and the prospect of rebuilding daunting.

"Our thanks at this time go to all those who have worked towards the goal of peace and the end of violence.

"As members of the Universal Church, we are called to play our part in supporting that task of rebuilding, for the Church of our Lord Jesus Christ saw birth in that region and continues to bear witness there.

"On this day we stand in solidarity with our sisters and brothers in Palestine and Israel and we pray for them."
